# Adjectives – Qualitative and Quantitative

### **STUDY NOTES**

Adjectives

An *adjective* is a word that describes a noun. It tells you more about the kind, or quantity of the noun. Therefore an *adjective* is a word that adds more meaning to the word it is describing.

### Examples -

- 1. Roma is wearing a long gown.
- 2. There are **two** pens in the pen stand.







So, in the above sentences the words like long and two describes the nouns such as long gown and two pens, so they are called as adjectives.

#### Types of Adjectives –

# Following are some examples showing the use of adjectives of quantity in sentence:

- She eats a whole apple daily.
- I ate some rice today.
- He has only little knowledge about this project.
- He cannot spend his all money over you.
- There is no milk in the glass.
- All the students have passed the exam.

So, here in the above sentences the words like – whole, some, little, all, no describes about the quantity or position of the noun. So they are called **quantitative adjectives**.

## QUALITATIVE ADJECTIVE:

This is the adjective which tells about quality...

### **Example:**

- He is a **handsome** boy.
- Ali speaks **loudly**.

An adjective that describes the quality of a noun (what kind/type) is called a **qualitative adjective.**
