

Words that describe a noun or a pronoun in a sentence are called adjectives.

Now let's learn how adjectives are used to compare two or more nouns or pronouns.



An adjective in it's base form is said to be in the positive degree.

Example -

clean, easy, heavy, fat, nice etc.

When we add –er at the end of an adjective to compare two nouns, we call it in the comparative

Example -

Clean - cleaner

Easy – easier

Heavy – heavier

Fat – fatter

Sweet - sweeter

We add –est at the end of an adjective to compare more than two nouns. This form of adjective is said to be in the superlative degree.

Example -

Clean – cleaner - cleanest

Easy – easier - easiest

Heavy – heavier - heaviest

Fat – fatter - fattest

Sweet – sweeter - sweetest

More examples -

clean	cleaner	cleanest
easy	easier	easiest
fat	fatter	fattest
flat	flatter	flattest
heavy	heavier	heaviest
hot	hotter	hottest
narrow	narrower	narrowest
noisy	noisier	noisiest
simple	simpler	simplest
thin	thinner	thinnest
wet	wetter	wettest

Now let's learn how to change an adjective in the positive degree to it's comparative and superlative forms.

• If an adjective does not end with the letter e, -er and -est added to form the comparative and superlative degree, respectively.

Example –

Strong stronger strongest

Deep deeper deepest

• If an adjective does not end with the letter e, -r and -st added to form the comparative and superlative degree, respectively.

Example –

Wide wider widest

Wise wiser wisest

• If an adjective ends in a consonant +y, we change y to –ier to form the comparative degree and to –iest to form the superlative degree.

Example -

Funny funnier funniest

Easy easier easiest

• The last letter of some adjectives is repeated, after which –er and –est are added to form the comparative and superlative degrees, respectively.

Fat fatter fattest

Big bigger biggest
