Read these lines







- The sun **is shining** and the birds are singing.
- The other animals **are relaxing** in the shade of the trees.
- The mother **is looking** for her baby.
- We **have read** all about the birds and animals.

The words in **red** in the sentences - **is, are** and **have** – are called **auxiliary verbs**.
Auxiliary verbs are also called **helping verbs**.

An auxiliary verb is often paired with the main verb to form the tense.

AUXILIARY VERB	PRESENT TENSE	PAST TENSE
<p>be</p> 	<p>Singular – am, is</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>I am watching a movie.</p> <p>He is watching a movie</p>	<p>Singular – was</p> <p>Example:</p> <p>I was watching a movie.</p> <p>He was watching a movie</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">be</p> 	<p>Plural – are</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>We are watching a movie.</p> <p>They are watching a movie</p>	<p>Plural – were</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>We were watching a movie.</p> <p>They were watching a movie</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">do</p>  	<p>Singular – does</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>He does not eat pizza.</p> <p>She does not eat pizza.</p>	<p>Plural – Did</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>Did you eat pizza?</p> <p>Did they eat pizza?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">have</p>  	<p>Singular – has</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>Sriya has completed all the work.</p> <p>Raj has completed all the work.</p>	<p>Plural – had</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>She had completed all the work.</p> <p>You had completed all the work.</p> <p>They had completed all the work.</p> 
<p>Personal & Plural – do</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>I do not eat pizza. You do not eat pizza. They do not eat pizza.</p>	<p>Personal & Plural – have</p> <p>Example :</p> <p>I have completed all the work.</p> <p>You have completed all the work.</p> <p>They have completed all the work.</p>
