
Parts of a Sentence

Subject and Predicate

STUDY NOTES

At a glance:

- A sentence is a group of words that makes complete sense by itself.
- The naming part of a sentence is called **the subject**. The subject is the person, animal, thing or place that the sentence is about. It can be a noun, a pronoun or a group of nouns.
- The telling part of a sentence is called the predicate. The Predicate is the part of the sentence that contains a verb and gives information about the subject.
