Adverb of Place



ADVERB OF PLACE



An adverb of place is a word that tells you where something is. Some common adverbs of place are here, there, and everywhere.

Can you hear that
noise there?



EXAMPLES:

adverb	example
downstairs	The kids are downstairs.
east	I'm moving to the east.
everywhere	I've looked everywhere for my glasses.
far	I come from a galaxy far away.
here	You don't live here.
in	Please come in.
indoors	Come indoors, it's getting chilly.
inside	The drill is inside the toolbox.
near	The cheese is near the cucumber.
nearby	I live nearby.
nowhere	I have nowhere to go tonight.
