what are PREPOSITIONS?

A preposition is a word that shows the relationship between an object (**a noun or pronoun**) and other words in a sentence.



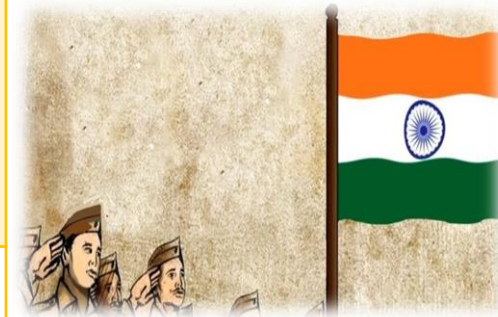
Prepositions may be used to indicate position, place, direction or time.

Look at the following sentences

- I will meet Samriddhi **at** 4 o'clock today.
 - The cat sat **on** the mat.
 - Let's walk **towards** the theatre.
- The words **at**, **on** and **towards** are preposition.
- In the above sentences :
- At** – used to show the time
- On** – used to show the place
- Towards** – used to show the direction



<p>PREPOSITIONS OF PLACE</p>	<p>Tells us about a place or position of a noun or pronoun.</p>	<p>On, in , at , beneath, beside, inside , against , behind</p>	<p>Example: Raghu was waiting inside the store.</p>
<p>PREPOSITIONS OF TIME</p>	<p>Show when something happens.</p>	<p>In , at , during, on, since, for, ago, before, until , till, during</p>	<p>India became independent in the year 1947.</p>
<p>PREPOSITIONS OF MOVEMENT OR DIRECTIONS</p>	<p>Shows the direction in which a noun and pronoun is moving to or from a place.</p>	<p>To, through, towards, over, out, across, along</p>	<p>I walked slowly across the road.</p>
