ADJECTIVES

The French word *tout*, which has many meanings including "all," "any," "every," "entire," and "most important," is one of the most common words in the French language. It has four possible forms:

singular		plural	
masculine	tout [tu]	tous [tu]	
feminine	toute [tut]	toutes [tut]	

ADVERBES

An **adverb** is a word that modifies a verb, an adjective, or another adverb. It often expresses how the subject performs an action. In French, many adverbs are formed by adding an ending to the masculine or feminine form of the related adjective. Many English adverbs are generally recognized by their "-ly" ending. The equivalent French ending is *-ment*.

Masculine Form of Adjective	Feminine Form of Adjective	Adverb
lent (slow)	lente	lentement (slowly)
sûr (sure)	sûre	sûrement (surely)
sérieux (serious)	sérieuse	sérieusement (seriously)
heureux (happy)	heureuse	heureusement (happily, fortunately)
frais (fresh)	fraiche	fraichement (freshly)
partiel (partial)	partielle	partiellement (partially)
complet (complete)	complète	complètement (completely)
régulier (regular)	régulière	régulièrement (regularly)
