He stood in politics, defeated at the age of 34 and was defeated in senatorial race at the age of 45, failed in an effort to become Vice President at the age of 47, again lost a senatorial race at the age of 49. Then he was elected President of the United States at the age of 52. This man was Abraham Lincoln.

Would you call Lincoln a man of failure? But do Lincoln, defeat was a detour but not a dead end.

Successful people do not do great things, they only do small things in a great way.

One day, a partially deaf four year old child came home with a note in his pocket from his teacher.

“Your Tommy is too stupid to learn, get him out of the school.”

His mother read the note and answered

“My Tommy is not too stupid to learn, I will teach him myself” and that Tommy grew up to be the great “Thomas Edison”. Thomas Edison had only three months of formal schooling.
