Robert Lee Frost was born on 26 March 1874 in San Francisco, United States. He was an American poet. His work was initially published in England before it was published in America. He is admired for his descriptions of rural life of New England.

He is called American Wordsworth.

### **HIS PHILOSOPHY**

- He is neither complacent nor pessimistic.
- Frost considered the poet to be an accidental collector of impressions and knowledge.
- We can trace this in the present poem- Dust of Snow.





## **ABOUT THE POEM**

The present poem "Dust of Snow" was published in "New Hampshire", a poetic work in 1923. This collection gave him the Pulitzer Prize.







### **CENTRAL IDEA OF THE POEM**



- The poem consisting of only 8 lines gives a very deep meaning.
- It expresses the significance of small things in changing one's attitude.
- The poem explains that the little things in life can make huge changes in our future.
- It also reflects that hard times in the life will lead to happiness if human beings persist with it.
