From pessimism to optimism

SYMBOLISM

- The use of symbols to represent ideas, especially in literature/ a person, an object that represents a more general quality or a situation.
- Crow stands for- bad omen/inauspicious
- Snow stands for- degeneration/passivity
- Hemlock tree stands for- death/ poison



STANZA 1: The way the crow.....hemlock tree

In this stanza the poet recounts a small incident on a winter day. The poet was standing under a hemlock tree. The top of the tree was covered with snow. The poet was in a state of depression and sorrow. He was lost in his own thoughts. Suddenly a crow perched on the top of the tree. The sudden movement of the crow made the dust of snow fall down. The shower of the snow flakes from the hemlock tree is evidently the subject matter of this poem, since it touched the poet in some way.

STANZA 2: Has given....had rued

The falling of fine dust of snow on him gladdens his heart. A change comes into his mood. His mood brightens all off a sudden. He has given up all his hopes. But now cheerfulness replaces the sense of regret. It makes him feel that say has not been a complete waste. Atleast a part of the day has been saved since it gives him a new experience. Finally the dust of snow cheers his dejected mood sad heart.





VOCABULARY

- Dust of snow: fine particles of snow.
- Hemlock tree: a poisonous tree or plant with small white flowers(North American Conifers)
- Way: manner
- Shook down: shook the snow dust down
- A change of mood: change in the present condition of mind
- Part: portion
- Rued: regretted deeply/ felt sad deeply
