



- It is believed that on this day the lord Rama killed Ravana, the ten-headed demon king.
- In West Bengal and some other states, Dussehra is celebrated as Durga Puja.







GURUPURAB



- Gurupurab means the festival of the guru.
- Langar are held, where free meals are given to all.
- The holy book of the Sikhs called Guru Granth Sahib is read on this day.
- There is a big celebration in the Golden Temple at Amritsar.





EID-UL-FITR



- Eid-ul-Fitr is celebrated to mark the end of a month long period of fasting called Ramzan.
- Prayers or Namaz is offered at mosques.
- They greet and wish each other 'Eid Mubarak'.
- A special sweet dish called 'sewain' is prepared.
