In these 94 lines of William Blake's power, the Chimney sweeper a little boy is telling the story of his desparing like as well as the sad tales of other chimney sweeper boys. The little boy natorales that he was very young evhen has mother died. He was then sold by his father to a Master sweeper when his age was so tender that he couldnot ever pronounce the loosed sweep and cryingly pronounced it weep and wept all the fine. The pun intended through the use of the wood every three times in the third lin of 1st stanza holds pathetic significance. Most chimney sweepers like him were so young that they also co pronounce it as same.
