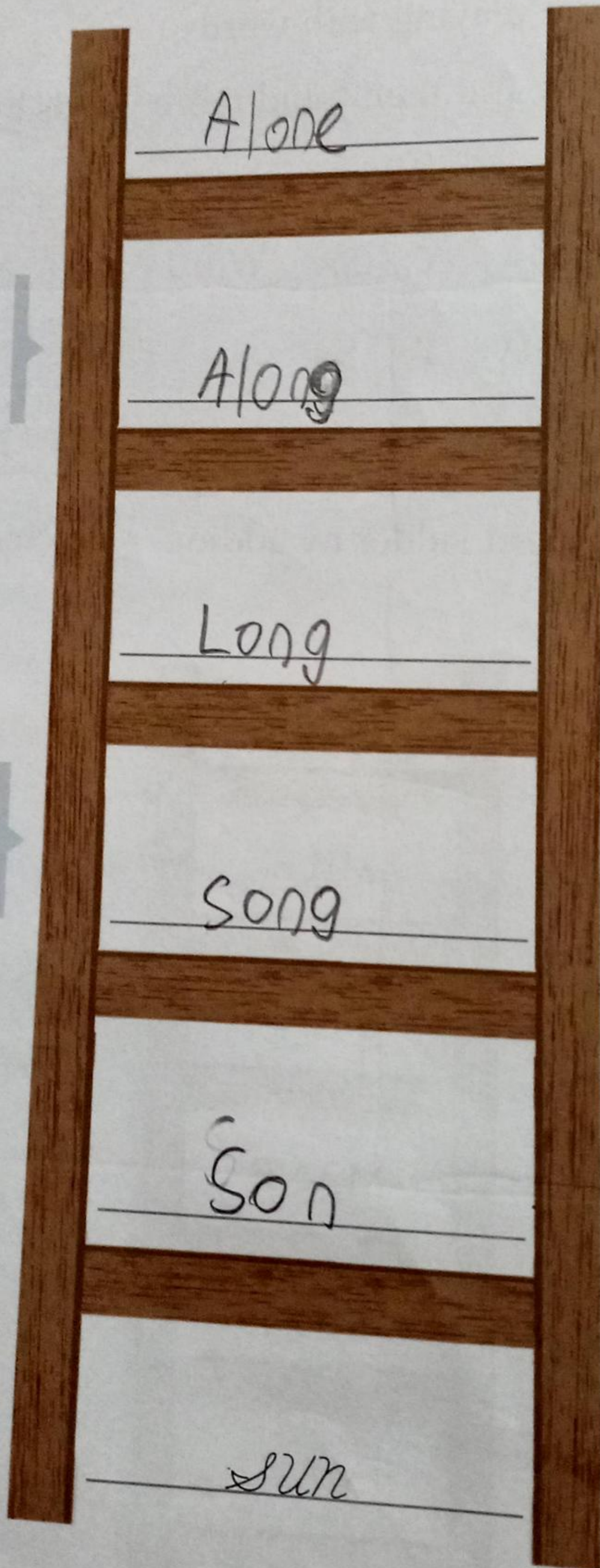

The telling part tells us different things about the naming part.

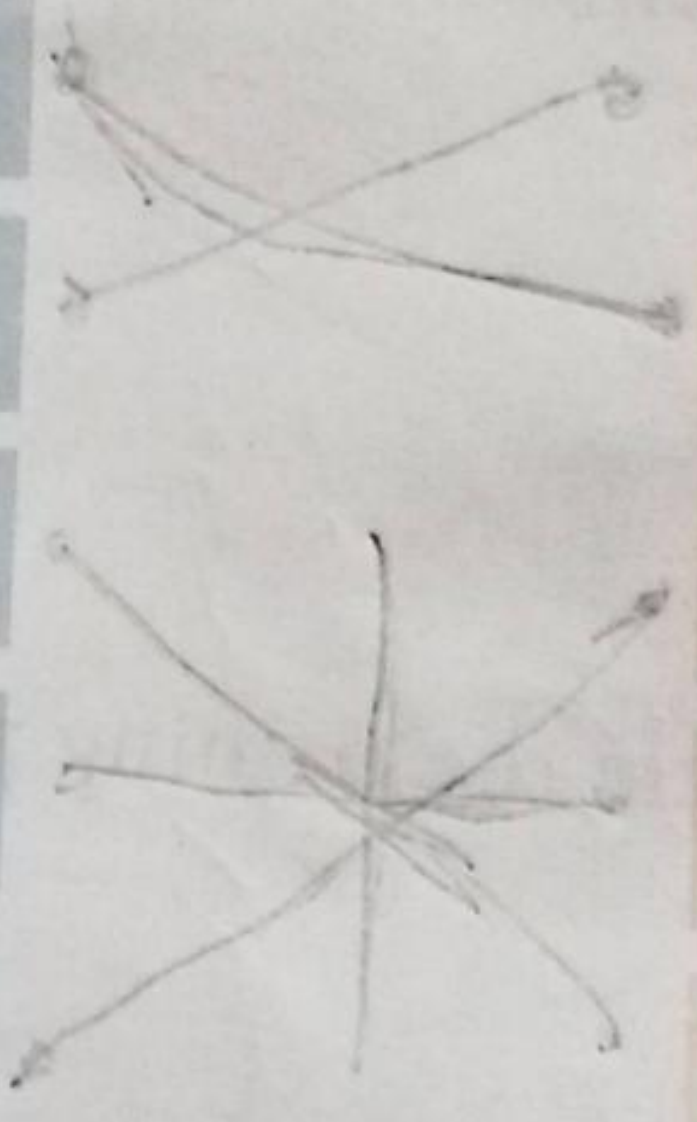
