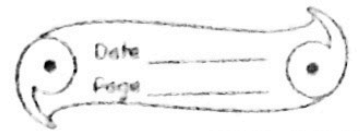

Prometheus to share the knowledge of fire with human beings.

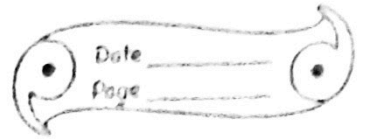
But . . . What should we do then . . . Let him suffer till the end of the time.
