2. During the time of Revolt of 1857, Rebel troops



From Meerut Marched to Delhi and compelled him to take the nominal leadership of the Revolt.

3. He was arrested by British army after it captured Delhi.

4. After the revolt was shot down by British, he was exiled to Burma (Myanmar).

5. After leading the Revolt, He spent the last five years in Rangoon, Myanmar.

Q- Even though the Revolt of 1857 did not succeed, it taught the Indians a lesson. Explain

A- Yes, though the Revolt of 1857 did not succeed, it taught Indian some important lessons:

1. It taught us to remain united as the revolt did not succeed because some Indians were also sided with Britishers.
2. It made India realize the value of freedom.
3. Indians realized the injustice of the British as those ~~workers~~ who were getting bribes got nothing (except some silver coins of low value).
