A- Poaching is the most immediate threat to wild tigers. Every part of the tiger - from whisker to tail has been found in illegal wildlife markets. A result of persistent demand, their bones, and other body parts are use for modern health tonics and folk. Tigers have loss an estimated 95% of their historical range. One of the world's and most uniquely - adapted, tiger population are found in the sundarbans - a large mangrove forest area shared by India and Bangladesh. However, rising sea levels caused by the climate changes threaten to wipe out these forests and the last remaining habitat of this tiger population. According to a WWF study, without mitigation efforts, projected sea-level-rise - about a foot by 2070 - could destroy nearly the entire sundbans tiger habitat.
