Answer:-

1. The worker's quarters and factories were located on the right of the River Neva.
 - on the left bank, were fashionable areas the winter palace and official buildings including the place where Duma met.
 - The winter was very cold - there had been exceptional frost and heavy snow.
 - The fashionable quarters and official buildings were surrounded by workers, the gaurd.

- Imposed a curfew.
- On Sunday the govt suspended the Duma.
- Demonstrators returned in force to the streets of the left bank on the 26th.
- On the 27th, the police Head quarters were ransacked.
- The streets thronged with people raising slogans about bread, wages, better hrs and democracy.
- The cavalry was again called but they refused to fire on the demonstrators.
- ~~that eve~~ That evening soldiers and striking workers gathered to form a 'soviet' or 'council' in the same building as the Duma met, was called Petrograd Soviet.
- The next day, a delegation went to see the Tsar. Military commanders advised him to abdicate. He followed their advice and abdicated on 2nd march.
- Soviet leaders and Duma leaders formed a provisional govt to run the country.
- Petrograd had led the February Revolution that brought down the Monarchy in Feb. 1917.
