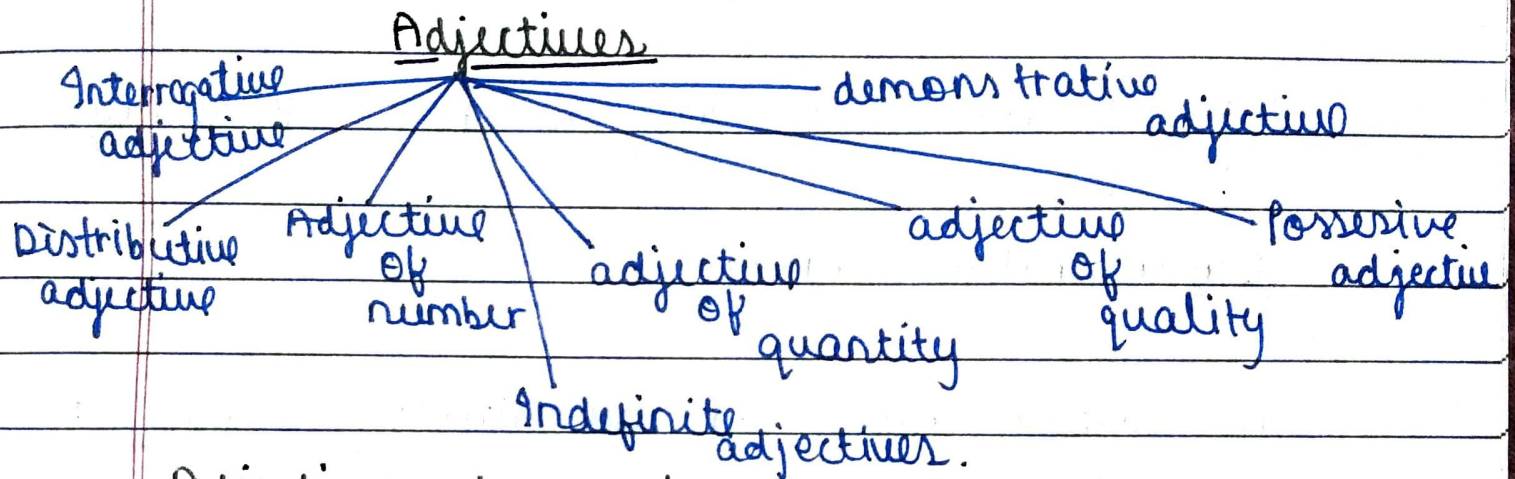


ADJECTIVES

An adjective is a word that tells us more about a noun. It 'describes' or 'modifies' a noun.



Adjective of number

An adjective of number provides us an information about the numbers of the nouns/pronouns.

For e.g. - There are 5 chocolates in the fridge.

Adjective of quality

An adjective of quality provides / describes an information of the quality of the noun.

e.g. - Mohan is a talented artist.



Adjectives of quantity

An adjective of quantity describes information about the quantity of the noun.

e.g - I don't do any workout these days.

Demonstrative adjectives

A demonstrative adjective directly refers to something or someone.

e.g - That dress is mine.
These puppies are adorable.

Possessive adjectives

A possessive adjective indicates possession. It suggests the belongingness of something or someone.

e.g → My dress is green in colour.

His car has amazing features.



Interrogative adjectives

An interrogative adjective asks a question. It must be followed by a noun.

e.g - which shampoo do you use?
what do you want to order?
whose phone is this?

Indefinite adjective

An indefinite adjective describes or modifies a noun specifically.

e.g - I need some time to finish this work.
There are few candies left ~~that~~ in the jar.

Distributive adjective

A distributive adjective is a describing word that refers to separate things. Such as - 'each', 'every', 'either', 'neither', etc.

e.g - Every student is asked to bring a jotter.

Degree of comparison

There are three degrees that compare one thing to the other. They are:

- 1) positive
- 2) comparative
- 3) Superlative

Examples :-

<u>Positive degree</u>	<u>Comparative degree</u>	<u>Superlative degree</u>
Bad	worse	worst
Good	better	best
big	bigger	biggest & etc
