A. Answer these questions.

1. Why is the whale crying?

Ans. The whale is crying for all its family members that have been killed by humans. We are slaughtering various species for our own benefit. Instead of the whale's life, we are chasing lipsticks and polishes and other products that are made of whales.

2. Which lines in the poem tell you what whales were used for?

Ans. The lines "lipstick for our painted faces, polish for our shoes" tell us that the whales are used for.

a. What are these lines describing?

b. Why does the speaker describe it as 'keening'?

4. What are 'painted faces'? How does the speaker feel about them?

products they provide instead of letting the whales we are choosing make up pollution and other beauty products they provide instead of letting the whales live we are choosing luxury items for ourselves.

B. Think and answer:

1. Why is the poem titled 'The Song of the Whale'?

Ans. Whales make high-pitched sound whistling kind of sound to communicate with each other. This appears like a song to human ears. Hence, the poet has used the title 'The Song of the Whale' to emphasize the desperate cry of pain as cry for help from whales against human exploitation. 2. Who is the speaker addressing in the poem? why does he do that?
