His speaker tells the reader that throughout life there are always going to be those who tell you something "cannot be done". They will "Prophesy" or predict your "failure" at any number of things you care about. The poet uses anaphora in his repetition of the words. "there are thousands" for the third time in the third stanza. There is a great emphasis placed on the number of people who want to see "you" fail.
