Ans- India has one level of government at the centre, the union government. And one level of government at the state level, the state government. The body that governs India at the centre, i.e., India's union legislative is known as the parliament. It is the highest law-making body of the country. It consists of the Rajya Sabha (Council of states) and the Lok Sabha (House of the people).

The three organs of government, namely, the legislature, the executive and the judiciary are independent of each other. There is a clear-cut separation of power between the three organs of gov. +. The executive is answerable to the legislature for its actions. Both the executive and the legislature are in turn answerable to the judiciary.
