- Cowboys often work with horses to herd cattle and sheep.

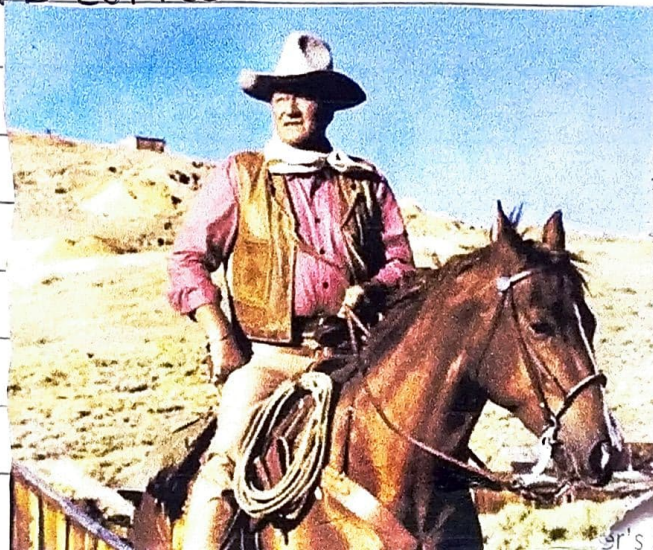


Who is a Cowboy?

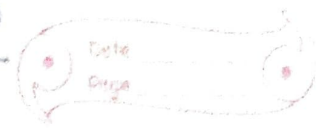
