Q7) What is the difference between economic activities and non economic activities?

Ans) The activities that add value to the national income are called economic activities involve the activities performed for pay or profit. and non market activities include the production done for self consumption.

The activities that add no value to the national income are called non-economic activities. The domestic chore is an example of non-economic activities.

Q8) Why are women ~~per~~ employed in low paid work?

Ans) The wage distribution for men and women has been a major concern for the society. Women are mostly paid less than men. One major reasons for this is meagre education qualification of women - They are employed in sectors which don't provide them with proper maternity leaves, child care benefits and other provisions and are also responsible for managing household work. Hence they are paid less than men. Skill is another reason why wages of women are less than

men. Men are considered more skillful in comparison to women. Despite equal physical work, due to this reason women are employed in low paid work.

Rural and urban areas both have unemployment. In the case of the rural population, there is seasonal unemployment and in urban areas there is educated unemployment.
