- The process of conserving soil by retaining the moisture in the soil is called mulching.

Contour

- Contours are imaginary lines connecting places that lies at the same altitude.

- Practised in arid areas.

- Practised on hill sides.

5. Alluvial soil and laterite soil

Alluvial soil

- It is formed by the deposition action of rivers.

laterite soil

- It is formed due to intense leaching in region with heavy rain.
- It is fertile
- It is found in Indo-Gangetic Plains and the deltaic regions of the ~~and~~ ^{and} Kerala, Odisha, Tamilnadu and West Bengal.
- It is not fertile
- It is found in coastal Maharashtra, Karnataka and Kerala, Odisha, Tamilnadu and West Bengal.

6. Arid and peaty soil

Arid soil

- It is found in the dry regions.
- It is not very rich in humus.
- It is found in Western Rajasthan.

Peaty Soil

- It is found in dense vegetation.
- It is very rich in humus.
- It is found in forest of Jharkhand, Bihar, Uttaranchal.
