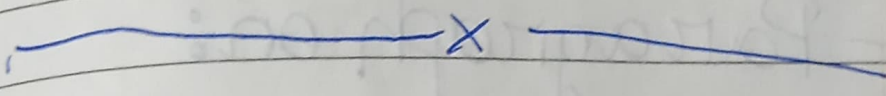
My parents didn't tell me many stories. Mum was busy with her parties, and Dad with his stamp collection; that is, when he wasn't in his office. So I had the house
