where he was and who the other pilot was.

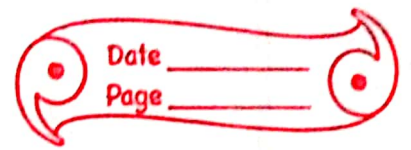
Q4) What made the woman in the control centre look at the narrator strangely?
