A cyclotron is a type of <u>particle accelerator</u> invented by <u>Ernest O. Lawrence</u> in 1929–1930 at the <u>University of California</u>, <u>Berkeley</u>, and patented in 1932. A cyclotron accelerates <u>charged particles</u> outwards from the center of a flat cylindrical vacuum chamber along a spiral path. The particles are held to a spiral trajectory by a static magnetic field and accelerated by a rapidly varying (<u>radio frequency</u>) electric field. Lawrence was awarded the 1939 <u>Nobel Prize in Physics</u> for this invention.

Cyclotrons were the most powerful particle accelerator technology until the 1950s when they were superseded by the <u>synchrotron</u>, and are still used to produce particle beams in physics and <u>nuclear medicine</u>. The largest single-magnet cyclotron was the 4.67 m (184 in) <u>synchrocyclotron</u> built between 1940 and 1946 by Lawrence at the <u>University of California, Berkeley</u>, which could accelerate protons to 730 mega electron volts (<u>MeV</u>). Close to 1500 cyclotrons are used in nuclear medicine worldwide for the production of <u>radionuclides</u>.

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A galvanometer is an <u>electromechanical measuring instrument</u> for <u>electric current</u>. Early galvanometers were uncalibrated, but improved versions, called <u>ammeters</u>, were calibrated and could measure the flow of current more precisely. A galvanometer works by deflecting a pointer in response to an electric current flowing through a <u>coil</u> in a constant <u>magnetic field</u>. Galvanometers came from the observation, first noted by <u>Hans Christian Oersted</u> in 1820, that a <u>magnetic compass's</u> needle deflects when near a wire having electric current. They were the first instruments used to detect and measure small amounts of current. <u>André-Marie Ampère</u>, who gave mathematical expression to Oersted 's discovery, named the instrument after the Italian electricity researcher <u>Luigi Galvani</u>. Galvanometers have been essential for the development of science and technology in many fields. For example, in the 1800s they enabled long-range communication through submarine cables, such as the earliest <u>transatlantic telegraph cables</u>, and were essential to discovering the electrical activity of the heart and brain, by their fine


