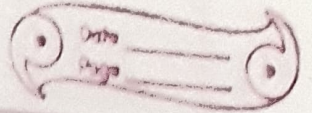

Ans. - The different strategies of the British to acquire new territories in the country are:-

Subsidiary alliances =

In the subsidiary alliances system, an Indian ruler had to maintain British troops in his state, either by giving some of his territory or by paying for the maintenance of the troops. This system allowed the British to maintain a large army at the expense of local ruler.

Annexations =

Annexations means to take control of a neighbouring territory, usually with the use of force.
