### Difference

#### Luminous

2.

Objects that emit light energy by themselves are known as luminous objects.

- These objects can cause the sensation of light.

- The luminous objects are visible as they emit light on their own.

- The sun and candle are the two examples.

#### Non-luminous

Objects that cannot emit light energy by themselves are known as non-luminous objects.

- These objects do not cause the sensation of light.

- The non-luminous objects are visible because of luminous objects.

- The moon and plants are the two examples.
