• Objects that emit light energy by themselves are known as luminous objects.

• These objects can cause the sensation of light.

• The luminous objects are visible as they emit light on their own.

• The sun and candle are the two examples.

Non-luminous

• Objects that cannot emit light energy by themselves are known as non-luminous objects.

• These objects do not cause the sensation of light.

• The non-luminous objects are visible because of luminous objects.

• The moon and plants are the two examples.
