1. The peace treaty of Versailles with the Allies was a harsh and humiliating peace! Justify.
  - After the first world war Germany was forced to sign a treaty by the Allies power which was called the treaty of Versailles.

  - Germany lost its overseas colonies, one-tenth of its population and 13% of its territories, 75% of its iron and 26% of its coal to France, Poland, Denmark and Lithuania.
