- After the first world war Germany was forced to sign a treaty by the Allies power which was called the treaty of Versailles.

- Germany ~~lost~~ lost its overseas colonies, one-tenth of its population and 13% of its territories, 75% of its iron and 26% of its coal ~~was~~ to France, Poland, Denmark and Lithuania.

- The war guilt clause had Germany responsible for the war and damages the Allied power suffers.
 - Germany was forced to pay compensation amounting to 6 billion
