ans:- Reserved Constituencies are the constituencies in which seats are reserved for scheduled castes and tribes based on the size of their population.

Q2) What is our system of election?

⇒ The Lok Sabha and the Vidhan Sabha elections are held in India every five years.

⇒ The Lok Sabha election is called the general elections.

⇒ There are certain elections, that are conducted in a particular constituency owing to the death/resignation of a member. These are called by-elections.

Q3) Why it is important to ~~not~~ update voter's list?

In democratic elections, just like the elections held in India, the list of people eligible to vote in a constituency is prepared much before the elections and is officially called as the Electoral Roll or simply the voters list. It is updated from time to time. Each constituency has its own voters list.

Importance :-

- ⇒ It includes the names of people who can cast their vote during the elections in a constituency.
- ⇒ It makes sure a single person can't cast two votes. It helps in the prevention of duplicate votes.
- ⇒ It adds the names of people who have crossed the age of 18 so that they will be able to cast their votes in the elections, and the names of persons who are late.
- ⇒ It ensures universal Adult Franchise that is mentioned in the constitution of India.
- ⇒ It ensures that there is no corruption during elections.
