1) What was the impact of first world war on Germany?

The impact of first world war on Germany:-

- \* Germany lost its overseas countries, one tenth of the population, 13% of its territories, 75% of its iron, 26% of its coal to France, Poland, Denmark and Lithuania.
- \* The Allied powers demilitarised Germany to weaken its power.
- \* The War guilt clause held Germany responsible for the war and damages suffered by the Allied Powers.

\* Germany was forced to compensate 6 billion to Allied Powers.

\* The Allied powers also occupied the resource-rich Rhineland for much of 1920's.

2) Who were called as November Criminals? Why?

Weimar republic alongwith the people who supported weimar republic were known as November Criminals because they signed the treaty of Versailles which was the humiliation treaty for Germany at 11:00 am on 11<sup>th</sup> November.
