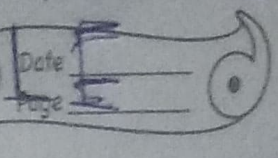


DIFFERENCE BETWEEN COMMUNICABLE AND NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASES

non-communicable diseases

1) Communicable diseases are those diseases which can be transferred from one person to another.

1) Non-communicable diseases are those diseases which have not spread from one person to another person.

2) They are generally caused by some bacteria, protozoa, viruses.

2) They are generally caused by some nutrient deficiency, allergy.

3) It cannot be inherited from one generation to another.

3) It can be inherited from one generation to another.

4) the example of communicable diseases are Aids, typhoid, malaria, cholera etc.

4) the example of non-communicable diseases are allergy, heart disease, diabetes

5) as it develops over a period of time and lasts for long

5) As it can develop almost immediately.
