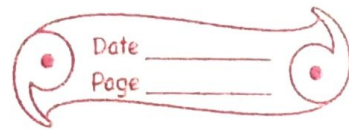

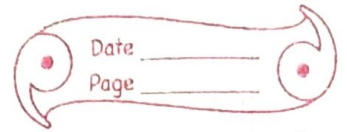

The Harappan Seal is possibly the most distinctive artefacts of the Harappan or Indus valley civilisation. Made of a stone called steatite, seals like this one often contain animals motifs and signs from a scripts that remains undeciphered. Yet we know a great deal about the lives of the people who lived in the region from what they left behind - their houses, pots, ornaments, tools

and seals - in other words, from archaeological evidence. Let us see what we know about the Harappan civilisation, and how we know about it. We will explore how archaeological material is interpreted and how interpretations sometimes change. Of course, there are some aspects of the civilisations that are as yet unknown and may even remain so.

The Indus valley civilisation is

also called the Harappan culture.
Archaeologists use the term "culture"
for a group of objects, distinctive
in style, that are usually found
