

ans The February Revolution in Petrograd.
Explanation:-

- The workers quarters and factories were located on the right bank of the River Neva. On the left bank were the fashionable areas, the Winter Palace.
- Due to the extreme climate, there were shortage of food.
- And due to the shortage of food, men were angry and march to strike in sympathy.
- Fashionable quarters and official buildings were surrounded by workers, the government imposed a curfew.
- On Sunday 25 february, the government suspended the Duma.
- On 27th, the Police headquarters were ransacked.

- The government tried to control the situation and called out cavalry once again. However, cavalry refused to fire on the demonstrators.
- By the evening soldiers and striking workers had gathered to form a 'Soviet' or council in the same building as the Duma met. This was called Petrograd Soviet.
- The next day, a delegation went to see the Tsar. Military commanders advised him to abdicate.
- Soviet leaders and Duma leaders formed a Provisional government to run the country.
- Therefore, Petrograd had led the February, Revolution that brought down the monarchy in February 1917.

By the evening soldiers and striking workers had gathered to form a 'Soviet' or council in the same building as the Duma met. This was called Petrograd Soviet.
